New Library Services

The Luther Area Public Library is proud to offer two new services to its patrons:

1. If you have a computer disc, DVD, music disc, or game disc that is scratched and needs repair and/or cleaning, the library has a new Disc Repair Machine, thanks to Great Lakes Energy and their People Fund Grants. Bring your scratched disc into the library and for a small fee of \$2 per disc, we will clean it to the best of our ability.
2. The library is now offering 6 new Verizon Hotspots for patron checkout. A hotspot is a small device you can use to connect a wireless enabled device, such as a laptop, smartphone or tablet to the internet. Hotspots are portable, so you can connect your device to the internet almost anywhere you are, like at a home, in town or in the park. The hotspot device works in any area covered by the Verizon network.

To be eligible to check out a hotspot from the library, a user must:

- Be a library card holder in good standing with no outstanding charges, or missing items, and have a current account.
- Be at least 18 years of age with a valid driver's license or state ID with current name and address.
- Read, understand, and sign the Hotspot Lending/Borrower Agreement.
- The hotspots are funded by the federal Emergency Connectivity Fund (ECF) and can only be provided to patrons who declare they do not have access to the equipment or services sufficient to access the internet.

If you feel that you meet the eligibility requirements for checking out a device, please come to the library to check one out. Hotspots will be checked out on a first come, first serve basis for a period of 3 weeks, with up to one renewal if there is **not** a waiting list.

Attention Great Lakes Energy Customers

Great Lakes Energy customers in the Reed City service area are coming closer to having Trustream fiber internet service available. If you are interested in this service follow the instructions below. The more interest there is in the service, the quicker it might get here. Internet service has been slow coming to the area for most of us, but right now this appears to be the most likely reliable service in the near future.

- Phase 1 fielding is anticipated to begin later this summer. Phone and email notifications will be sent prior to our fielders working in your area.
- Members are encouraged to share their interest by visiting <https://www.trustreamfiber.com/check-eligibility/> to help determine where we go next! Click on “My Account” to login to your account or register as a “New User” if you haven’t done so already.
- Several factors go into the decision, including demand, funding availability, and constructability of an area.

Launching of ReadMichigan.org

A cooperative effort between Library of Michigan and the presses of University of Michigan, Michigan State University and Wayne State University has launched a unique collection of regional ebooks available to all residents of Michigan. The ReadMichigan.org statewide eBook collection initially consists of 300 eBooks published by local university presses about Michigan and the Great Lakes region.

The homegrown collection includes winners of the prestigious Michigan Notable Books award as well as other important books published by Michigan presses and authors. Residents and visitors to the state of Michigan can access these eBooks (with no wait lists or hold) via geolocation at any time at www.ReadMichigan.org. Michigan Humanities has provided important financial support and is also a founding partner of the project.

FREE COVID-19 Tests from the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) has procured a limited number of COVID-19 at-home (Over the counter/self-test) tests to partner with agencies who can assist in increasing access to COVID-19 testing resources. This program aims to increase access to free COVID-19 testing resources for individuals, families and communities who may otherwise struggle with access to healthcare resources, be hesitant to visit a COVID-19 testing location or may lack the funds necessary to purchase at-home test kits for themselves or their families. The **Luther Area Public Library** is one of those agencies.

1. Who can receive a test?

Tests may be provided to anyone interested in receiving a free test kit. Library will ask for address only for distribution purposes only. This information will not be kept nor shared with anyone.

2. How many tests can one person receive?

Library staff may provide one test kit per person in a household **daily**, up to 5 people.

Ex. 1: Mary states that they have 4 individuals in their household; therefore library staff can provide Mary with 4 COVID-19 at-home test kits for her household.

Ex. 2: Mark states that he has 8 people in his household. Library staff will be limited in providing only 5 test kits to Mark for his household due to supply limitations.

3. Does the library staff have trained individuals on how to use these tests?

No. MDHHS has provided written documentation explaining how to use, when to use, and what to do when receiving a positive or negative test result. Library staff **CANNOT** administer tests, nor provide any further directions for their use. Patrons are responsible for self-reporting and will be provided with the information on the handout sheet and the QR code on the kits.

Affordable Connectivity Program for Internet Service

The Affordable Connectivity Program is an FCC program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service.

The benefit provides:

- Up to \$30/month discount for internet service;
- Up to \$75/month discount for households on qualifying Tribal lands; and
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider.

A household is eligible if one member of the household meets at least one of the criteria below:

- Has an income that is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines;
- Participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, SSI, WIC, or Lifeline;
- Participates in Tribal specific programs, such as Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribal TANF, or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations;
- Is approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program of the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision;
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating broadband provider's existing low-income program.

Affordable Connectivity Program enrollment opened on December 31, 2021. Eligible households can enroll through a two-step enrollment process. (1.) Going to [ACPBenefit.org](https://www.fcc.gov/affordable-connectivity-program-providers) to submit an application or print out a mail-in application and (2.) Contact your preferred participating broadband provider (<https://www.fcc.gov/affordable-connectivity-program-providers>) to select an eligible plan to have the discount applied to your bill.
