
## **Outdoor Recreation Industry Support Webinar**

## LAKE COUNTY SESQUICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION Saturday, September 25 – Saturday, October 2, 2021

One hundred and fifty years ago in 1871 Lake County was organized into a formal county. We are celebrating this event with activities throughout the county.

The Lake County Sesquicentennial Salmon Run will kick off the week's activities on Saturday morning, Sept. 25<sup>th</sup>. At noon the Spears Grove one-room school north of Chase, the 1901 Eden Township Unit School in Irons, and the Big Bass Lake School (now the Sauble Township Hall) on Big Bass Lake will be open for tours until 3:00 p.m.

Saturday and Sunday the Luther Area Museum will be open for tours.

Sunday the 26<sup>th</sup> the Shrine of the Pines Furniture Museum south of Baldwin will host a nature walk and Sid Woods will present a program on Native American artifacts that have been collected in Chase Township at the Chase Library and History Room. The program will be followed by a tour of the Gould Cemetery – a Native American burial site.

Additional cemetery tours will be given at the Peacock Cemetery and Chase Township Cemetery, at 6:00 p.m., Monday and Tuesday evenings respectively.

Wednesday evening, September 29 the Lake County Historical Museum in Baldwin will host an Evening with Our Elders at 6:00 p.m. and on Thursday, September 30<sup>th</sup> a concert beginning at 7:00 p.m. Illinois folk singer/songwriter Chris Vallillo will return to the Boat House stage to present a concert featuring folk music from 1870 to 1910, all performed on vintage instruments.

The American Flag that Governor Baldwin gave the county in 1871 was donated to the Lake County Historical Museum several years ago. During the work week the Lake County Courthouse will display the flag in the Commissioner's Room for the public to view.

Friday afternoon's activities include a Model "A" Ford Street Show in downtown Baldwin and on Saturday afternoon, October 2nd, the Luther Area Museum teams up with the Luther Lions Club to offer their annual tea. Entertainment will include music from at barbershop quartet and a kitchen band. A Chili Cook-off is also planned in Weber Township for Saturday afternoon.

Activities ongoing during the Sesquicentennial week will include a Fall Farmer's Market at the Tiki Hut in Chase, a walking tour of store windows in Baldwin will show off the businesses pride in our history, and special displays of Michigan and Lake County historical books will be exhibit at the Pathfinder Library, Chase Area Library and the Luther Area Library. Restaurants throughout the county will be offering 1871 themed specials as well. The Lake County Historical Museum will debut a new exhibit "Life in

the 1870s – what our ancestors' life was like when they arrived in this new wild land called Lake County". The exhibit will be open for tours Wednesday – Saturday, Noon to 4:00 p.m. Docents will be in 1871 costume during the week.

Closing ceremonies will be held at the Wenger Pavilion in Baldwin Saturday night, October 2<sup>nd</sup>. The Pine Stump Savages will provide old-time music intermixed with a Founders Tribute and other activities.

Lake County Sesquicentennial commemorative sweatshirts and mugs will be available throughout the county early-September. Watch the Lake County Star Newspaper and the Lake County Historical Museum/Michigan Facebook page mid-September for additional activities as they are firmed up and for a detailed schedule of events.
